LIVERPOOL ROYAL INFIRMARY SCHOOL OF MEDICINE.

An Introductory Lecture, on Thursday, Oct. 1st, at two o'clock, by Mr. A. T. H. Waters.

Annual Exhibitions.—Royal Infirmary medical scholarship, value 42*l*., consisting of a gold medal, value 10*l*. 10*s*., and six months' free board and residence, with dressership and clerkship in the Royal Infirmary. In case the scholarship is gained by a resident pupil, six months' payment (31*l*. 10*s*.) will be returned to him.

Four exhibitions, value 31*l*. 10*s*. each, consisting of free board and residence at the Royal Infirmary for six months, with dressership on award of the medical board.

THE LIVERPOOL ROYAL INFIRMARY contains 226 beds.

Six dressers and six clinical clerks will be elected quarterly, by selection and examination, from amongst the house and out-pupils of the infirmary, from the students attending the school in their second and third session, and from all medical pupils who have entered on their third year of professional education. The office will be tenable for two successive periods. Pupils of the infirmary are admitted to learn pharmacy for six months. A clinical prize is instituted for annual competition.

Students are admitted to the practice of the Rainhill County Asylum, near Liverpool, for three months, on payment of a fee of four guineas, and to the practice of the Eye and Ear Infirmary, Liverpool, for three months, on payment of a fee.

Infirmary Apprentices.—Four apprentices are admitted for five years to reside and board in the house, for 60 guineas per annum; and for one, two, or three years, upon payment of 70, 130, or 190 guineas. These sums include library and lecture fees, but not hospital practice.

Clinical lectures are delivered by the physician and surgeons.

LIVERPOOL EYE AND EAR INFIRMARY: For three months' attendance on the practice, fee 3*l*. 3*s*.

RAINHILL COUNTY ASYLUM, near Liverpool: For three months' ditto, fee 4*l*. 4*s*. Certificates from these institutions are received by the examining board of the East India Company.

The laboratory term is divided into three sessions, each of seventeen weeks.

Students may also attend one hour, two hours, or three hours, &c., per day or per week. If a student pay forty guineas in advance, he may work in the laboratory every day for three years.

When a pupil has completed an investigation of importance, he will receive a testimonial of proficiency.

The College Library, to which pupils have access, contains every chemical work of note.

Practical Course.—Medical students desirous of obtaining their certificates for the Apothecaries' Hall, of London or of Ireland, may attend any hour from ten A.M. till five P.M. each day during the week for their practical instruction. Fee, 3*l*. 3*s*. per session of four months.

THE NEWCASTLE INFIRMARY contains 230 beds. According to the last Annual Report, the number of in-patients was 1916; of out-patients, 2664; and of casual patients, 4676.
